OUR THANKS to Terrance McCracken for his enrichment of our worship this morning.

PETER CORNELIUS, a nineteenth-century German composer, is best known for this morning's anthem at the early service. While he gives a lyrical setting of the Epiphany text to the solo voice, the accompaniment is the chorale "How Brightly Shines the Morning Star," a mainstay of this season's hymnody. Henry "Harry" Thacker Burleigh (1866-1949), the arranger of this morning's second hymn, was an African-American classical composer, arranger, and professional singer.

Considered by many to be the first black composer to be instrumental in the development of a characteristically American music, Burleigh helped to make black music available to classically-trained artists both by introducing them to the music and by arranging the music in a more classical form.

Bible Basics (Library) Leaders: Ellen Anderson and Scott Brunger

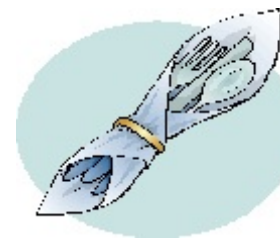
The Bible Basics class is for adults of all ages and Bible experience. This winter we will start by studying the Psalms and their relationship to the New Testament Gospel.
