Tenebrae is not really a service. The word means “darkness” or “shadows” and first began to appear in church liturgies around the seventh century. Tenebrae has come to symbolize the darkness and somber tone of the accounts of Christ’s suffering and crucifixion, reflected in the scripture readings, in the music, and in the silence of the people as they leave the sanctuary.

The “Strepitus” means “loud noise” and is signified by the slamming of a book or door at the conclusion of the service. Originally, the strepitus was a loud noise made by the abbot to signify to the monks, who were in silent meditation, that the liturgy of the hours was over. It has come to symbolize the harsh reality of the death of our Lord.

This evening’s prelude comes from Johann Sebastian Bach’s *Orgelbüchlein* (Little Organ Book), a collection of chorale preludes intended to cover the entire liturgical year. Though not completed it contains a number of his most well-known and loved works, among them *O Mensch, bewein*. This chorale prelude features the chorale melody in a highly ornamented and florid style (played this evening with a registration our organbuilders describe as “crying”) accompanied by extremely expressive supporting harmonies. In the closing measures one can almost sense the last footsteps of Christ and his intense suffering, and even a glimpse of our salvation to come.

Organist John Grew will be heard in recital at Westminster Church on Friday evening, April 9, at 8:00 as part of this season’s *Musica Organi* series. Mr. Grew is Professor of Organ and University Organist at McGill University in Montréal and an internationally active concert organist. The recital is cosponsored by the Knoxville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Admission is free and the congregation is cordially invited to attend. A nursery will be provided. Do come join us that evening!
