**GIOVANNI PIERLUIGI DA PALESTRINA (c. 1525-1594)** was one of the finest composers of polyphony in the *stile antico*. Seen as perhaps the last major composer of his era, Palestrina's form and style would soon give way to the forward-looking *stile moderno* of the early Baroque. This morning's anthem is one of his best known motets.

**HABITAT BLITZ DAY**

**Saturday, July 24**

The summer build is rapidly approaching, with Blitz Day Saturday July 24. Westminster will partner with Central Baptist Bearden for this project and we are actively recruiting workers, both for construction and support jobs (food, drink, recycling, etc.)

On Blitz Day our goal is 15 workers for each of the AM (7:30-12:30) and PM (11:30-4:00) shifts. Habitat rules require a signed waiver prior to work (these are available in the church office from Renee) and limit workers to age 16 and above (18 to be on a ladder or use power equipment). Lunch and plenty of drink will be provided on Blitz Day.

The build site is in the Vestal area of South Knoxville just off Cherokee Trail. The actual address will be 1103 England Drive. More detailed information regarding parking will available soon and sent to volunteer workers prior to the workdays.
