THIS MORNING'S ORGAN AND CHORAL MUSIC survey French composers. Alexandre Guilmant held prominent positions in Paris, serving as organist at la Sainte-Trinité from 1871 to 1896 and teaching at the Paris Conservatoire, where he succeeded Charles-Marie Widor in 1896. Louis-Nicolas Clérambault, a contemporary of J. S. Bach, served as organist at St. Sulpice in Paris, where Widor would eventually also serve. Louis Vierne was the titular organist at Notre Dame in Paris from 1900 to 1937. Though his son, Jehan, is perhaps better known as an organist and composer and his daughter, Marie-Claire, as an organist and teacher, Albert Alain (1880-1971), too, was an organist, as well as a composer and amateur organbuilder. His teachers include Fauré, Guilmant, and Louis Vierne. This morning's anthem is a lovely setting of Gregorian chant.

PLEASE TAKE TIME to look at the new art display in the Narthex and Schilling Gallery. Cindy Moon Fulton, daughter of Judy and Joe Moon, is displaying her ceramic masks in the Schilling Gallery show cases. Cindy's masks reflect her work as a mental health worker with adolescents. Local artist, Beverly Gleeson, is exhibiting her paintings which reflect the theme of Appalachian life and culture. We appreciate these artists sharing their gifts with us.
