DOMENICO ZIPOLI, an Italian organist and composer, was a contemporary of J. S. Bach, but unlike the latter, his career took him far from home. Beginning as the organist of the Jesuit church in Rome, he left for Seville (Spain) in 1716, where he entered the Jesuit order. Within the year he sailed from Cadiz to Córdoba (Argentina) and from 1718 until his death was organist of the Jesuit church there.

ORGANIST STEPHEN HAMILTON will be heard in recital at Westminster on Friday evening, February 17, at 8:00 as part of this season's *Musica Organi* series. His program will include a wide variety of music that will make full use of the many colors of our organ. Featured will be music by Jehan Alain, J. S.
