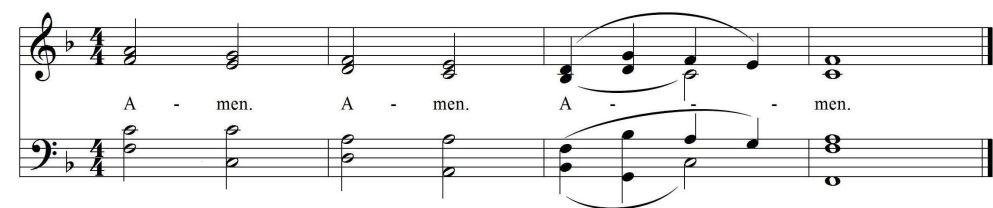

THIS MORNING'S PRELUDE comes from the extensive library of music transcribed for brass by Robert King of North Easton, Massachusetts. Begun by Mozart, possibly in 1773 in Salzburg (the manuscript paper used helps to support this), the work was completed by an M. Stadler (the final eight measures). Thought to be originally scored for organ, it features dense counterpoint, with frequent entrances of the subject (the opening theme) in both its original and inverted forms.
